Advance decision (Living will)

General background

Advance decisions used to be called living wills. They are sometimes also called advanced directives. They allow you to refuse life-sustaining treatment should you no longer be able to make decisions about your healthcare. They are usually used when your condition is likely to be .

While you may also request life-sustaining treatment, no matter what your prospects of recovery, doctors do not have to respect these requests. They

When to write a living will

You can make a living will at any time provided you are over 18 years of age. You do not need to have, or suspect you have, a medical condition or be close

So as to prevent your advance decision being challenged, it is important that no-one can claim that you were influenced in your decision to make it by anyone else - particularly by anyone that might stand to benefit from your death. It is therefore advisable that you don't discuss your living will with family or friends before you have signed it under witness.

You do, however, need to have mental capacity - to understand, remember and make use of information relating to your decision and the consequences of it. A medical doctor is the best person
