### Statutory declaration template with examples

## General notes:

- 1 If the declaration is required in connection with a court case, then the case heading, as given in all other papers relating to the case, should be placed on this document. If there is no “case” in court,

- 2 The name of the declarant

- 3 The “signing” words should be as set out. It should be signed to the right of the word “signed” in the presence of a solicitor

- 4 Any attachment or (old word) “exhibit” should be presented with the declaration. Attachments are not to be physically attached to the declaration. They are sometimes valuable and should not be mutilated in any

- 5 The body text is for “ ”.

- 6 If you are dealing with some other person, or an organisation such
